

**INTERDISTRICT AGREEMENT (IA)
FOR COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES
2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR**

This Agreement is hereby entered into by and between the Pierce County Skills Center, Pierce County, Washington, which is hereinafter referred to as the "**SERVING AGENCY**," and **Omak School District (Washington Virtual Academies)**, Okanogan County, Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "**PARTICIPATING DISTRICT**".

The purpose of this Agreement is to utilize interdistrict cooperation, authorized by RCW 28A.335.169, RCW 28A.225.250, and Chapter 392-135 WAC, to provide educational programs not otherwise available and to avoid duplications of specialized programs and facilities. These objectives will be achieved by enrollment and attendance in programs at the Pierce County Skills Center.

This agreement gives Pierce County Skills Center permission to access student address information from the data resource management center of the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** to be used for mailing newsletters, program brochures, summer school information, and student information.


For the purpose of this agreement, it is understood that students attending the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** and the **SERVING AGENCY** shall be funded for all classes up to 1.6 full time equivalent as determined by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction per the 2021-22 Enrollment Handbook with no more than 1.0 FTE reported by either the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** or the **SERVING AGENCY**. For this agreement, the **SERVING AGENCY** shall be authorized to claim up to .8 FTE for each student and the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** may claim up to .8 FTE. The **SERVING AGENCY** or the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** may claim an additional .2 FTE for the total of 1.0 FTE after consultation with the other to determine if the .2 FTE remains unclaimed. Students from non-member districts will be enrolled on a space-available basis. Students from member districts will receive priority with regards to any wait-listed programs.

SERVING AGENCY will employ a SPED liaison/support staff position that will coordinate all special education students at the PCSC.

The **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT** shall be responsible to:

- provide ancillary services for the student(s)
- administer state testing
- pay a portion of the SPED liaison's salary based upon the **PARTICIPATING DISTRICT'S** percentage of the total number of SPED students enrolled in the PCSC based on the average of the October and February count, due on or before August 31, 2022
- pay a fee of \$150 per student per year to the PCSC Capital Maintenance Fund based on the average of the October and February count, due on or before August 31, 2022


This Agreement is for the 2021-22 school year and must be signed by the appropriate officials prior to confirmed enrollment of the student(s).
