In addition to student representatives elected by members classes held that period, the meetings are attended by elected Class Officers, elected Club members, and other SLHS student and/or staff leaders that support the organization and execution of school-sponsored activities.

ASB Executive Board – The Associated Student Body Executive Board consists of eight students who represent Spanaway Lake High School in various positions with specific responsibilities. Qualified candidates can run during the annual election period each Spring for the positions of President, Vice President, Student Activities Coordinator, Public Relations Director, Treasurer, Secretary, Financial Secretary, and Club Coordinator. The former four positions are filled based on majority vote by the entire student body, while the latter four are appointed by an official Elections Committee made up of current ASB Officers and supporting Staff members.

Class Officers – Class Officer groups consist of four students who represent their graduating class in various positions with specific responsibilities. Qualified candidates can run during the annual election period each Spring for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, and Class Representative. Freshman Class Officers are filled based on majority vote by members of their class only.
